



### Aaghaz-e-Dosti - An introduction

Aaghaz-e-Dosti (literally beginning of friendship) is an Indo-Pak Friendship initiative. The members are all either students or young professionals and are involved in this voluntary initiative in addition to their regular work.


Started in 2012 by Mission Bhartiyam, Aaghaz-e-Dosti aims to create unwavering bonds of peace and friendship between India and Pakistan. Aaghaz-e-Dosti seeks to enhance peopleto-people relations. It seeks to become the medium to discover and recognise the misrepresented reality on the other side of the border. It is focused on citizen diplomacy and works primarily through peace education aimed at familiarising the people about the 'other', countering stereotypes, homogenised and negative image of the other, educating them about the issues of conflict, the existence of diverse views and developing critical thinking and developing confidence in dialogue and peace building for conflict resolution.


It has involved itself in peace building and conflict resolution by facilitating people-to-people contact, challenging mutual hatred and suspicion, creating a culture of peace and understanding among people of both countries and highlighting the issues of victims of conflicts.


Aaghaz-e-Dosti founder Ravi Nitesh describes that Aaghaz-e-Dosti has given peace trainings to more than 10000 students and youngsters through many Aman Chaupals (peace session) across India and Pakistan where an Indian guest addresses the queries of students in a Pakistani school and vice versa. We have also used video conferencing in our Aman Chaupal sessions to facilitate interaction between people of India and Pakistan. Aaghaz-e-Dosti also uses video conferencing to connect classrooms of India and Pakistan in sessions called Indo-Pak Classroom Connect that facilitates interaction between students of India and Pakistan. In addition, Aaghaz-e-Dosti conducts regular Exchange of letters and cards between students of India and Pakistan and has exhibited these letters at the renowned Faiz Ghar (house of Faiz Ahmed Faiz) in Lahore. Aaghaz-e-Dosti has also started efforts to have peace march from Delhi to Wagah Border on 14-15 midnight alongwith many other organisations and took successfully Aman Dosti March 2018 and Aaghaz-e-Dosti Yatra 2019 to spread message of peace.


Aaghaz-e-Dosti had made the list of prisoners and fishermen (stranded in jails on the other side of the border) **public for the first time** that helped lawyers, activists, and relatives of the victims for details. Not only this but Aaghaz-e-Dosti regularly raises appeals in issues of violence, ceasefire violations, killing of soldiers on LOC, discrimination being meted out to victims of conflict like prisoners and fishermen through statements as it believes that voice for peace and sanity often goes unrepresented in mainstream media. Aaghaz-e-Dosti has been constantly writing to the government on both sides on incidents of ceasefire violations, decisions made about talks, execution of decisions made in meetings.





















On social media, Aaghaz-e-Dosti carries stories of friendship, articles, poems, and expressions (submitted by common people) for highlighting similarities between Indians and Pakistanis in terms of culture and most importantly, in desire for peace and friendship, bursting stereotypes and need for peace.

One of the major initiatives of Aaghaz-e-Dosti is the annual **Indo-Pak Peace Calendar**. Every year Aaghaz-e-Dosti launches an indopak peace calendar that has paintings or expressions of hope from students of both countries. It also carries messages from renowned personalities working and or for Indo-Pak peace launched in both countries. It has been also been presented to high dignitaries on both sides.

Each passing day Aaghaz-e-Dosti continue to energize people on both sides of the border to foster peace and change the direction of the winds of in a more positive side. With continuous efforts since last many years, Aaghaz-e-Dosti has become one of the most prominent voices on Indo-Pak peace and has been felicitated with several awards and recognitions.

We also feel blessed with the Op-Ed articles written about Aaghaz-e-Dosti by people like Dr. Chaman Lal (Dainik Bhaskar), Dr Syeda Hameed (<u>The Citizen</u>) and Dr. I A Rehman (DAWN News) and many other researchers found Aaghaz-e-Dosti initiative an important one in peacebuilding efforts and made its references in their research works and published papers and thesis. Aaghaz-e-Dosti has also been featured in many newspapers and videos including in the Narratives (By Project Narratives of Melton Foundation, UK) and VOX Media Documentary series on Borders. In its journey since last many years, Aaghaz-e-Dosti received huge support from common people, particularly youths and school students and also from renowned voices of South Asia through their participation, messages and support.





































































### Indo-Pak Peace Calendar - An Introduction

Another Major General M.A. Naik told that the real importance of peace can be well understood by a soldier. He insisted that peace building and developing a culture of peace is much required.





















### **Indo-Pak Peace Calendar - 2013**


The Indo-Pak Peace Calendar - 2013 was the first calendar. Aaghaz-e-Dosti featured peace messages from the following activists and advocates of peace:




